Entertainment in Copenhagen

Copenhagen offers a wide range of activities, which we for your convenience have split up into food, drinks and activities. Activities occurring during work hours relevant to spouses are listed below in 4. Spouse Activities.

Food

- 1. Rio Bravo Traditional Roast pork dinner
- 2. <u>La Glace</u> Traditional Danish pastry (oldest in town, high end)
- 3. Andersen & Maillard Coffee roastery and bakery
- 4. Kødbyens fiskebar Fresh sea food in the old meat packing district
- 5. Torvehallerne Market/Food Hall with divers selection of sweet and savoury
- 6. Reffen Street food on the outer harbourside of Copenhagen
- 7. Ø12 Scandinavian brunch (must be booked in advance)
- 8. <u>Isoteket</u> Organic gelato with fun flavour combinations
- 9. <u>La Banchina</u> vegetarian/pescetarian restaurant with the possibility of going for a dip in the harbour from its own little dock.
- 10. Gasoline Grill Popular burger restaurant with lots butter.
- 11. Cofoco Collective of 18 unique restaurants in Copenhagen

Drinks

- 1. BRUS Brewpub with craft beer
- 2. Taphouse 60+ draft beers from microbreweries
- 3. Pompette Wine bar focused on natural wine
- 4. Figo Wine bar with a wide selection of Italian wine
- 5. Conga Bar 70s inspired bar with a fine selection of beer and cocktails

Activities

- 1. Tivoli Gardens
 - They celebrate their 180th anniversary this year on August 15th, which they will celebrate from the 14th to the 20th august.
 - They offer jazz concerts on Wednesday evening with the Tivoli orchestra (7, 8 and 9PM) and fredagsrock (Friday rock) at 10PM, which on the August 23rd is with the Danish band Alex Vargas (These concerts are very popular in Copenhagen, so if you'd like to go, then be in the garden before 9PM to avoid queuing).
 - Fireworks in Tivoli goes off every Saturday evening at 11:30 PM
- 2. <u>Kastellet</u> The Citadel is one of the best-preserved fortresses in Northern Europe. Today it is used as a military base with barracks for the Danish Armed Forces. It is open every day for public access
- 3. <u>Canal tours</u> A great opportunity to explore Copenhagen from its waterfront
- 4. <u>Copenhill</u> Artificial ski slope on the roof of an energy plant, where you for free can walk to the top and see all of Copenhagen and the island of Amager. On top resides a little café, where you can enjoy something to eat and drink. Skiing or sledding down the hill again costs money. See website for prices.
- 5. Vor frelser Kirke (Our Saviour church)
 - Baroque church with an outer staircase around the twisted spire. Great views of Copenhagen (must be booked in advance)

Entertain outside Copenhagen

- 1. Louisiana Museum of Modern art
 - Located 1 hour north of Copenhagen on the coastline onlooking Sweden is one of the top 10 most visited attractions in Denmark.
- 2. <u>Kronborg</u> This renaissance castle is located 1 hour north of Copenhagen was immortalised as Elsinore in Hamlet by Shakespeare. Today it is part of the national museum, exhibiting Danish royal history and houses the legend of Holger Danske, whose statue in the basement, is said to come to life the day Denmark is threatened by enemies.

Spouse activities

- 1. <u>Thorvaldsens museum</u> art museum exhibiting Danish sculptor Bertel Thorvaldsen's marble and bronze art pieces
- 2. Planetarium
 - Exhibition of astronomy and space travel.
 - The cupola hall has an 8000 sq ft film screen for projecting films on NASA, Space Junk, Apollo 11, the solar system and others.
- 3. Museums
 - o <u>Christiansborg Palace</u> Home to the Danish Parliament
 - Rosenborg Renaissance castle placed in the Kings Garden. Exhibits the Danish crown jewels.
 - o Amalienborg Palace for the royal family
 - Amalienborg museum
 - Every day just before 12PM the <u>changing of the guard</u> occurs at Amalienborg. At 11:27AM the daily parade leaves from the Life Guard's Barracks on Gothersgade, Copenhagen and march by <u>Rundetårn</u> and <u>Kongens Nytorv</u> on their way to Amalienborg.
