

Transportation from the airport

Hotel location

Most will be staying at the Comfort Hotel Vesterbro, which is why all examples below will mainly take point of departure in this location. This document still contains relevant information even if you are staying somewhere else in the city centre.

Journey Planner app (Used by ALL Danes)

Use [Journey planner](#) in browser or download the app. This is a search engine for public transport in Denmark and comes with updates in case of delays or cancellations of public transportation. Google Maps is also commonly used for journey planning.

Arriving in Copenhagen

When arriving in Copenhagen you have three options of transportation towards the city centre.

1. Taxi
2. Train
3. Metro

Taxi

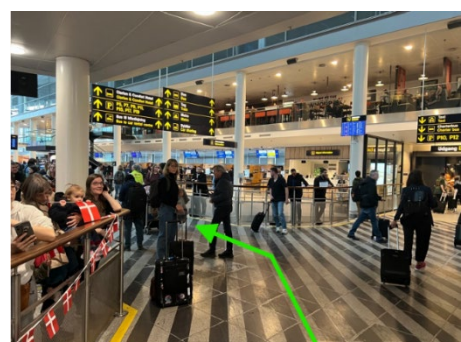
Taxi is the most expensive way to get to the city centre, as it will set you back \$35-\$50.

Staff from the airport are stationed here and can help you get a taxi.

Train/Metro

Train is the fastest way to get to Copenhagen Central Station, if you are staying at the Comfort Hotel Vesterbro. If you are instead staying somewhere near the harbour of Copenhagen or the inner city, Nørreport station or Kongens Nytorv station with the metro is probably a better option for you.

When exiting the baggage claim area at Copenhagen airport, you will run into an intersection, where you must **go left** and through the terminal towards the end of the big atrium.



Exiting baggage Claim

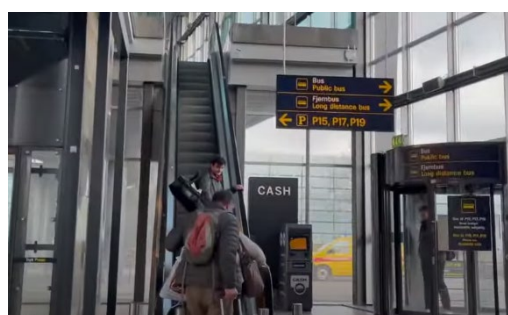
Train: Here you will find Track 2, where any train will stop at the central station. Either directly or with one or two stops.

Metro: If you walk past this and go up the escalator you will find the metro going directly towards Nørreport and Kongens Nytorv station.

Copenhagen airport is an end station. Therefore, all metros only go one way towards the city centre (see Metro map below on page 8 – yellow line M2).

Purchasing tickets for train and metro

There are 2 options for purchasing tickets for train and metro (and bus) in Copenhagen. Tickets for public transport can interchangeably be used for all modes of transport. This form of transport is the cheapest option in Copenhagen.

1. Ticket machine
2. DOT app (phone application)

Rejsekort

You will see some people use Rejsekort (travel card) to check in and out at the blue stands on stations and buses. This is **ONLY** for people with a Danish address and is ordered by postal service.

Disclaimer - Denmark is based on a trust system, which means you do not need to validate your ticket anywhere. You can freely enter any train, metro or bus with your ticket in your pocket.

This means that if you travel without a valid ticket and get caught by one of the *many* ticket inspectors, you will be fined **750-1000DKK = \$110-\$150**.

Ticket Machines

When you reach the end of the terminal at the airport you will find multiple red machines, under the sign DSB, for purchasing tickets for Train, Metro and Bus (one ticket can be used on all these modes of transportation).

Beware, a large queue can occur here at peak hours.

Staff will be there to help you during the day.

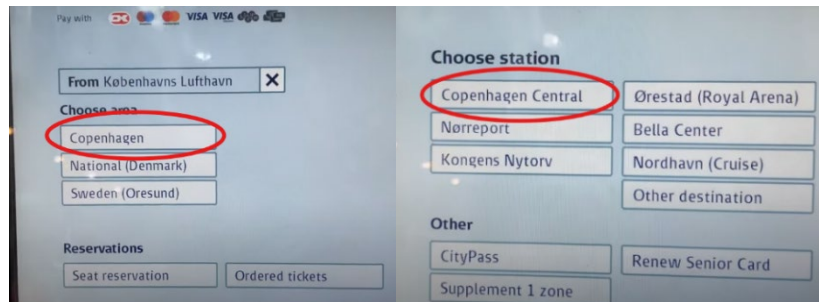


Ticket machines for train, metro and bus

If you just want to go to the Copenhagen Central Station:
 ‘Choose area’: Copenhagen

‘Choose station’: Copenhagen Central.

This trip costs about 30DKK or approx. \$5 for one way per person.

You can also purchase a [City Pass](#) between 24-120 hours (1-5 days).

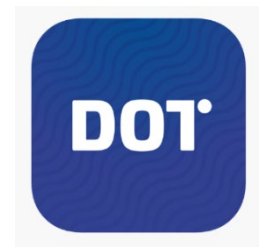
City Pass Small	City Pass Large
Zone 1-4 Copenhagen City Center	Zone 1-99 east coast of Zealand
Price: 90-340DKK = \$13-\$50 per person	Price: 180-680DKK = \$26-\$100 per person
Relevant if you want to travel endlessly inside Copenhagen (especially for spouses).	This can be used inside Copenhagen, with the train/bus to Lyngby where the Science Team meeting is held and all the way up to Helsingør, where Kronborg castle is located.
You will need to buy an additional 3 zones (30, 41 and 51) every day to get to DTU in Lyngby if you purchase this.	



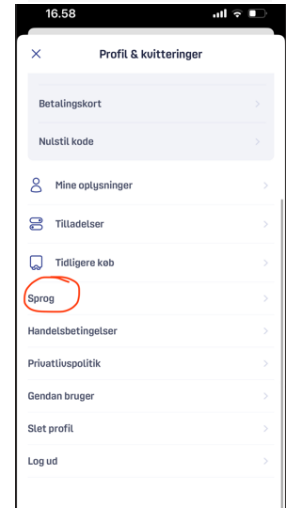
Map of the City Pass borders

DOT App

The phone application **DOT billetter** is a ticketing app, where you easily can purchase the same transport tickets as at the ticket machines mentioned above.



After setting up the app with your phone number you can change the language to English in the settings under the gear icon - “Sprog” (Language). No need to set up a whole account.

Now you can press “buy” at the bottom of the screen to purchase a ticket (See example below).

As you are a visitor in Copenhagen, we recommend either selecting “ticket” or “City Pass”.

The app is always taking point of departure in where you currently are, and which zone you are in. You can on pick a location on the map or type in the station’s/stop’s name.

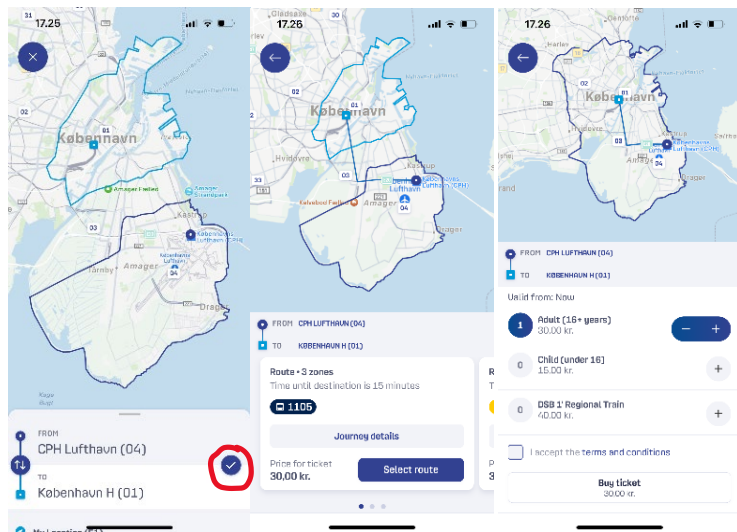
FYI: Copenhagen Central Station is called “København H”, and the airport is called “CPH Lufthavn” in the app.

The app will automatically suggest your location, which in this case is zone 4, where the airport is situated.

After picking the destination (København H) the app will suggest a couple of routes. In this case the train. “*Select route*” and select how many tickets you would like to purchase.

You can pay with either Apple Pay or a creditcard.



Transportation to the airport

Train

If you have decided not to buy your tickets on the DOT app, you have the option of purchasing them at all stations in Copenhagen.

At Copenhagen Central Station you will encounter the same red machines as at the airport. These are placed at the centre of the station. Here you can purchase tickets for the airport.

Furthermore, it is also possible to purchase the train tickets at one of the 7/11 stores at the Central Station or any other station that has a 7/11 attached to it.

The trains depart every 10 minutes and, in the evening, every 20 minutes.

Note that most trains going to Copenhagen Airport are continuing over the bridge to Sweden, so make sure you get off, as the airport is the last stop before crossing the border.

Metro

When going to the airport by metro you need to be aware of which line you are taking. Are you travelling from Nørreport or Kongens Nytorv station in the city centre you need to take the M2 line to Copenhagen Airport – the yellow Line (See metro map below). A loudspeaker on the station will announce which metro is incoming at which platform in both Danish and English.
